Sample Customized/Individualized Lesson Planning Sheet

This component is 5 pages in length and is included with each Gee Whiz unit. We provide a Word version (where providers can type in the boxes) and a PDF version. There is space on each page to record individualizations for up to 6 children. The sample below (completed) only includes columns with individualizations for one day for 3 children so it is easier for you to read. In the sample, we used abbreviations for the names of the activities planned during the day. For instance, WAMF stands for "Who Are My Friends?"

Sample Connecting the Dots Component

Each Connecting the Dots component is 16 pages in length. It shows providers, at a glance, how all 40 of the Gee Whiz Indicators (skills) are addressed during the unit. This makes it very easy for providers to quickly identify which experiences planned in the Gee Whiz unit address the skills they need to evaluate, reinforce, etc. This makes it much easier for providers to complete their chosen formal assessments.

Invite your child to help prepare a favorite food for dinner or a snack.




Out & About (Traveling):

These are JPEG files that providers can download and then text or email to parents/guardians. They are available in English & Spanish (2 per unit)


Looking at family photos with your child is a wonderful way for him/her to build an understanding of "family." As you look at photos together, be sure to use plenty of language and also ask a lot of questions!



Let's go on a name hunt! Print your child's name on index cards and hide around the room. Invite your child to "hunt" for the names. After finding them all, count to see how many names he/she found all together.












Ask your child these questions after sharing the story (if he/she is verbal). These are open-ended questions so in most cases, there is not a "right" or "wrong" answer.

What can you do now that you could not do when you were a baby?

How are you like your friends? How are you different from them? What do you think the world would be like if everyone was exactly the same?
